

Tool Shed

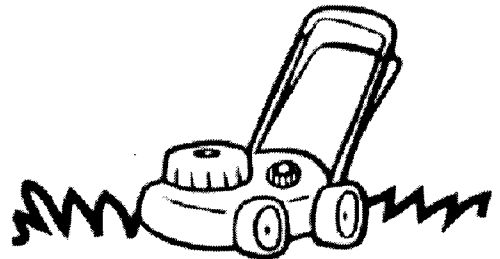
Directions: Give the child a copy of the picture scene on page 13, and the pictures below. Have the child color and cut out all of the pictures.

Activity: Ask the child to listen carefully. Read the following directions aloud. Put a ✓ in each box to easily track the child's progress.

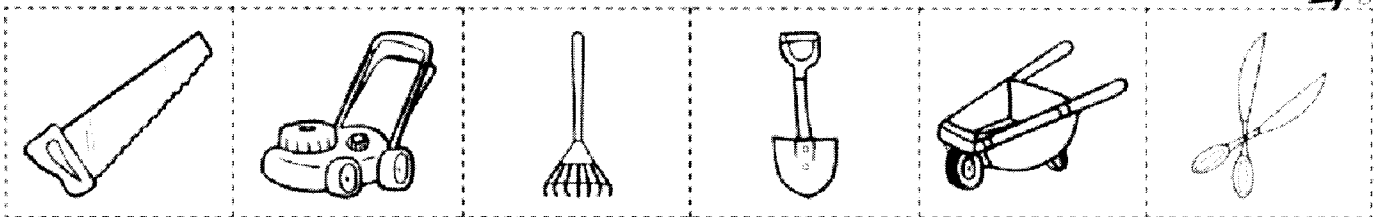
- ☐ Find something you could use to cut wood. Glue it on your page. (saw)
