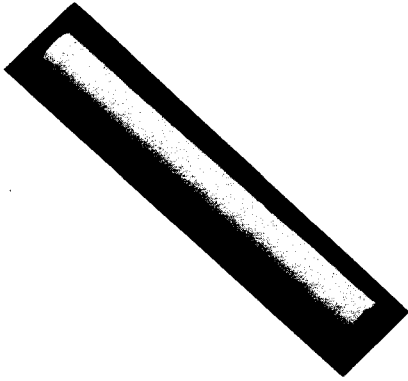

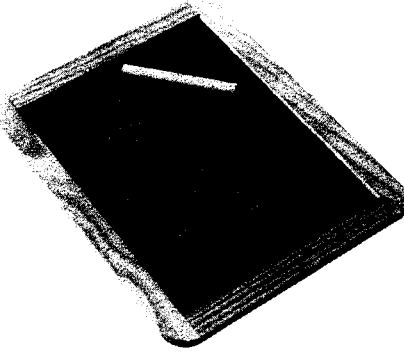
2. **BINGO, LOTTO, AND MEMORY MATCH GAMES** can easily be created with the photo cards. Use the reproducible Lotto game board (page 88) and the Bingo game card (page 89) to make the games. Complete directions for all three games are found on page 87.
3. **BACKPACK:** Directions for this reproducible activity are found on page 69.
4. **SURPRISE BOX:** Place a variety of classroom school tools in a box (pencils, crayons, markers, tape, paper clips, glue, ruler, paper, chalk, and scissors). One at a time, have the children close their eyes, put their hand into the box, and pull out an object. The children should be able to identify the object by simply touching it.
5. **LABEL IT:** This is an effective teaching method for any group of young children or children of any age who are being introduced to a new language and want to learn new vocabulary quickly. Simply label everything and anything you can in the classroom. You will be amazed at how many words the children learn to recognize in a relatively short amount of time.
6. **ART CENTER:** Organize an art learning center in your classroom. Help stimulate the children's imagination by providing an easel, paper, paints, playdough, crayons, glue, fabric, wrapping paper, and ribbon. The children will become familiar with using various art materials, increase fine motor skills, and build vocabulary as they experience all the different materials.
